

VACCINE

Anyone 12 years and older who lives in Virginia is eligible for a FREE COVID-19 vaccine.

- All Virginians are encouraged to get vaccinated to protect themselves, their loved ones and their communities.
- Vaccines offer the best form of protection against COVID-19.
- Getting most Virginians vaccinated is the best way to end the pandemic and get back to normal.
- Second dose scheduling with Arlington County Public Health will continue with the same process — people will receive a link to schedule a second dose appointment 4-7 days before you're eligible.

Vaccine Clinics

Arlington County's Public Health Division is offering free walk ins and scheduled appointments through [VAMS](#) to individuals 12 and up to receive a Moderna, Pfizer or Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine.

Please note: Children 17 years and younger must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian to receive their free COVID-19 vaccine. Please bring any form of identification to confirm your identity (examples include utility bill, paystub, insurance card or a driver's license).

1. **Arlington Mill Community Center** (909 S Dinwiddie St.) Monday – Friday, 11 a.m. – 7 p.m.
2. **Walter Reed Community Center** (2909 16th St. S) Saturday – Sunday, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.

Note: Walk-in and scheduled appointments are available for 1st and 2nd doses; Additional doses and booster doses REQUIRE an appointment

TESTING

Why get tested?

VDH recommends that the following people be tested for COVID-19:

- People with symptoms or signs of COVID-19 regardless of vaccination status.
- Most people who have had close contact with someone known or suspected to have COVID-19
- Fully vaccinated people should be tested 3-5 days following a known exposure to someone with suspected or confirmed COVID-19, even if you don't have symptoms.
- People who are not fully vaccinated should be tested immediately after an exposure and again at 5-7 days following exposure if the first test is negative
- People who tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 3 months and recovered, do not need to get tested after exposure as long as they do not have symptoms.
- People who participate in activities that are higher risk for COVID-19 exposure (e.g., travel, attending large events where social distancing is not possible, or being in crowded indoor settings)
- People who have been referred for COVID-19 testing by their healthcare provider or the state/local health department.
- People who plan to travel or who have recently returned from travel with some exceptions for fully vaccinated people
- People who are not fully vaccinated and who plan to visit people at high risk of developing severe COVID-19

Testing Availability in Arlington

Arlington County Curative Testing Kiosks (3 Locations) 11 a.m. to 7 p.m., daily (last appointments at 6:30 p.m.)

1. Virginia Highlands Park parking lot (1600 S Hayes St.)
2. Arlington Mill Community Center parking lot (909 S Dinwiddie St.)
3. Courthouse Plaza parking lot (2088 15th St N; corner of 15th St. N & N Courthouse Rd.)

- No appointments required, though they are encouraged to help reduce wait times: www.curative.com.
- No age restrictions
- Arlington residency not required
- No insurance required
- No doctor referral required or symptoms required
- No same-day results
